If there is an item that you would like to exhibit and we don't have a category for it, please get in touch with our committee as soon as possible.

All exhibition items can either be posted to PO BOX 82, Moora, WA 6510 or organised for drop off/collection by contacting David Hall on 0428 188 922.

All entry forms and fees must be submitted by the 25th of August.

- Carefully read the program and select the section and classes in which you will enter.
- You may submit all your entries on the same form additional forms are available online via our website.
- <u>Strictly</u>, 1 form per person. *Please do not submit multiples of family members entries on the one form.*
- Forward the completed form together with your entry fees to our Secretary before 25th of August.
- Take your exhibit to the Piawaning hall on Friday 1st of September, No later that 12 noon. There will be a steward available to assist you in displaying your entries in the correct area. Judging will take place Friday afternoon prior to the expo on Saturday.
- Ensure that your entry label is on each of the entries, using the entry labels on page 27. Items not labelled cannot be judged.
- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to arrange the collection of their exhibited items. They will be available for collection after 4pm on the 2nd of September (Day of Expo). Please only remove with a steward present.



Rules and Regulations

ENTRIES

- 1. Entries must be lodged with the Expo Committee member by the time stated for each section. Please try and have your entry forms submitted as early as possible.
- 2. Entries must be on the official entry form (or a copy of the form), lodged with entry fees paid and signed by the entrant or a guardian of the entrant if an over 18 person is required to sign it.
- 3. Late entries will only be accepted at the discretion of the Piawaning Expo President.
- 4. The Committee reserves the right to refuse, cancel or accept conditionally, any entry, without public explanation.
- 5. Unless elsewhere noted, exhibitors may enter as many exhibits in each class as desired.

EXHIBITS

- 6. Exhibits may only be entered under the name of a single individual or stud. The Committee reserves the right to accept collective entries under particular circumstances.
- Exhibits must be in the hands of the Stewards by the time stated in the General Exhibition entry forms. Exhibits not presented by this time, may not be accepted for judging.
- 8. Anticipated judging times are nominated in the General Exhibition notes but may vary slightly at the Stewards discretion.
- Exhibit items must not be removed before 4.00pm on the day of the Expo. Exhibits will be judged on their merits and prizes awarded at the Judge's
- discretion.
 Exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor and except for livestock and
- certain classes, either grown or made by the exhibitor. No identification marks are to be visible on exhibits. Prize Cards awarded
- 12. are not to be removed from the Exhibit.

EXHIBITORS

- 13. Any Exhibitor interfering with Exhibits before or after judging will be disqualified.
- 14. All reasonable care will be taken to safeguard Exhibits, but the Piawaning Expo Inc Committee does not accept responsibility for any loss of, or damage to exhibits. It is a condition of entry that each Exhibitor shall hold the Committee blameless and indemnified against any legal proceedings arising from any such loss or damage. Exhibitors should claim their Exhibits at close of Expo as the Committee is unable to ensure safe storage.

- 15. Exhibitors should ensure their Exhibits are entered in the correct class. The Chief Steward may alter the Class of an exhibit if it is deemed inappropriate for the Class entered.
- 16. Advertisements are not permitted on any exhibit, stall, pen or enclosure prior to judging.
- 17. During judging, ONLY STEWARDS are to be in attendance of the Judges. Public and Exhibitors are not to interfere in the judging process in any manner.
- 18. Prize Money will be available from the Treasurer, which the Steward will be able to advise you on the day as to where they are located. For payment, Exhibitors must present their slip from their Prize Card and some form of identification.

GENERAL

- Vehicles not forming part of a vendors display must be removed from the Expo Grounds before 9.30am on the day of the Expo. Parking areas are provided.
- 20. Persons contravening the Rules and Regulations of the Piawaning Expo shall forfeit all Prize Money.
- 21. Ground space fees will be set out by the President of the Piawaning Expo and spaces allocated by Chief Grounds Steward.
- 22. All Exhibitors will be required to pay admission. Agricultural Society Members displaying membership cards have free entry to the show. The Committee will at their own discretion have some free passes available to hand out.
- 23. Any matters arising in connection with or incidental to the Piawaning Expo and which is not provided for in these rules, shall be decided by the committee.
- 24. The Committee has the right to remove any persons from the Piawaning Expo grounds without public explanation.

SPECIAL NOTICES

No dogs, pets or unauthorised animals permitted on the Expo Grounds. Alcohol is not permitted to be brought onto the grounds. Consumption and sale of alcohol is restricted to the licensed bar area from 4pm onwards.

Free camping is available. Campers stay at their own risk. No Campfires permitted.
